



## INTERNATIONAL ACADEMIC CONFERENCE "THE YEAR 1945 IN SILESIA" Opole, 9–10 October 2025

The year 2025 marks the 80th anniversary of the Soviet offensive through Silesia, the end of the Second World War, and the change in the region's national affiliation. We invite you to take part in an academic debate on these events and their consequences.

The titular year 1945 represents a turning point in the history of the Silesian region, bringing about a series of political, social, and economic transformations. We welcome contributions from both experienced scholars and early career researchers from Poland and abroad to join the discussion on these historic developments.

### Suggested Topics:

- **War**  
(Crimes and the collapse of the Nazi regime in the final phase of the war; the specificity of military operations in Silesia; the front's advance; death marches; martyrdom of the clergy; liberation of Nazi camps; casualties of war)
- **Authority**  
(Soviet rule in Silesia; the problem of dual power; establishment of Polish administrative structures; nationality verification; surveillance; propaganda; practical implementation of the "programme of fulfilment" – the new (or old?) myth of the Recovered Territories)
- **Society**  
(*The Upper Silesian Tragedy* – camps, population displacement processes; rebuilding social life; eyewitness accounts; war-related trauma; sense of temporariness)
- **Economy**  
(War damage; looting; nationalization of property and industry)
- **Culture**  
(De-Germanization; Polonization; the creation of Polish cultural and educational institutions)
- **Biographies**

- **Memory and Representation**  
(Sites of memory; film; literature; press; memoirs and testimonies; the discourse surrounding the year 1945)
- **Sources**
- **Education**  
(Educational projects; lesson plans; teaching materials)
